



Jürgen Brockmüller was born in the year 1958 in Bonn, Germany. After his medical studies and approval as physician in 1993, from 1994 to 1997, he worked as a PhD fellow at the Max-Planck-Institute of Molecular Genetics in Berlin on the structure of ribosomal proteins. From 1987 to 1993, Jürgen Brockmüller was postdoctoral fellow at the Institute of Clinical Pharmacology at the University Medical Center Benjamin Franklin in Berlin. He has the board certification in Clinical Pharmacology and his research focussed on pharmacogenetics and pharmacogenomics with emphasis on pharmacokinetics, drug transport and drug metabolism. From 1993 to 2000, Dr. Brockmüller was senior lecturer at the University Medical Center Charité in Berlin.

Since 2000, Dr. Brockmüller is professor of Clinical Pharmacology and director of the Department of Clinical Pharmacology of the University Medicine Göttingen, Germany and he is presently also head of the Center of Pharmacology and Toxicology. Present research priority of the department of Clinical Pharmacology of the University Medicine Göttingen is in functional pharmacogenetics and genomics. As a clinical pharmacologist, Dr. Brockmüller has a broad interest in translational research with the aim to apply clinical pharmacology and pharmacogenetics knowledge to the optimization of drug treatment in various diseases. The department of clinical pharmacology conducted by Dr. Brockmüller has the approval for postgraduate training (Weiterbildungsberechtigung) in clinical pharmacology.

Dr. Brockmüller is member of the committee of research strategies of the Georg August University Göttingen and member of the ethics committee. From 1997 to 2000 Dr. Brockmüller was chairman of the Ethics committee of the Georg-August-University Göttingen. Since 2005, Dr. Brockmüller is chairman of a postgraduate training and research initiative on pharmacogenetics in oncology supported by the German Research Foundation (DFG).
